Introduction

SABSA is a non-profit organisation formed in 2005 by a core group of business schools. It provides a platform for members to share best practices, experiences, and engage in critical discussions. It advocates and negotiates on behalf of members and fosters collaboration and engagement among business and academic colleagues. SABSA membership is for business schools offering a masters in business accredited by the Council on Higher Education, providing sector collectivism and diverse leadership to build relationships through collaboration and knowledge sharing.

- Assists in the development of those business schools in earlier stages of development;
- Contributes towards developing an appropriate quality assessment system for business education in South Africa;
- promotes co-operation with other associations having similar objectives;
- communicates the interests of the Association to the community at large;
- Undertakes activities in support of the Association's stated objectives or general principles as it may from time to time be deemed appropriate or necessary.

Our focus on research and academic writing is of strategic importance to strengthen business schools as key higher education institutions in our country's development agenda and we are making a significant contribution to the quadruple helix of government, business, academia and community.

Areas of focus continue to include a focus on South African executives and building on research trends around a business masters. Global partnerships open doors to engagement for all our members. A pipeline initiative is a mentorship programme to support new and emerging schools with experience, guidance and advice, especially in accreditation matters, curricula development, research support, case study development and engagement with the corporate sector.

Collaboration makes our Association stronger and reverting to working alone is no longer optional. Collective wisdom and the ability to discuss issues at a strategic level amongst peers is one of SABSA strongest cohesive features.
